## **COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 2023-18**

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DOVER, IN COUNCIL MET:

**WHEREAS**, on October 3, 2023, the Commission received a complaint filed by Cameron Eisenbraun alleging ethical violations by Council President William Hare; and

**WHEREAS**, once the Commission had reviewed the complaint, it was decided that in order to further evaluate the complaint the Complainant and the Respondent would be asked to appear at a hearing before the Commission in order to make a determination whether an ethical violation had occurred, all in accordance with Sec. 30-73(f), which hearing was duly held with both the Complainant and the Respondent giving testimony and responding to questions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission noted that since the Respondent is a City Official, the Commission may propose actions to the City Council that are appropriate to its findings in accordance with Sec. 30-73(o); and

**WHEREAS**, after the hearing was closed, the Members of the Commission voted unanimously that Respondent had made contact with a City Employee regarding her duties and functions, which should not have been made so that his conduct was in violation of the ethical standards provided in Secs. 30-20(a)(2), (3), (4), and (b); and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 30-73(o), the Commission unanimously decided that a censure of Respondent's conduct should be reported to City Council of the City of Dover.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, this censure of Respondent is directed to be served upon Council of the City of Dover for Respondent's actions and conduct with a City Employee, although he was pursuing a complaint issued by this employee on behalf of a constituent in violation of ethical conduct cited in Secs. 30-20(a)(2), (3) (4) and (b).
